- 9. Police Department Report: Police Chief Keplinger
 - a. Discussion on Incident Summary Report ó Chief Keplinger provided the incident report for the month.
 - b. Discussion on Training and Public Relations- Chief reported it was a busy month. Public Relations: National Bike to School day was last week and they had 5 more students than they had last year and the event was a success. Middle School Student Council presented the department and area emergency departments with goodie baskets showing their appreciation for all emergency workers in the area. Officer Hull attended the end of the year event at the school today. Department is currently working with the fire department and EMS with the Stop the Bleed Program. The department will get trained and then be able to train others on this program. Chief assisted the school district with a grant to get trauma kits for the schools for the Stop the Bleed Program. The State Attorney General has over \$100 million in grant money to award to schools for building safety. Chief assisted the school with a walk through of the buildings and helped the district identify some items that can be applied for to apply for the grant funds. Chief also met with Senecaøs migrant recruiter Pedro Portillo and his assistant Angel regarding the upcoming canning season. Training: All officers are on track for their annual training. Officer Baeten turned in his resignation as he was recently hired full-time by the City of Oconto Falls. Chief also announced that Zak Hoeft was recently hired as the newest member of the staff as a full-time officer.

10. Fire Department Report: Fire Chief Hicks

a. Discussion on Training, Public Relations, and Incident Summary Report ó

Fire Chief Hicks reported on May 13 they had MCI training for active shooter and one call on May 20 for a faulty carbon dioxide detector. The department active shooter training consisted of 240 emergency personnel (EMS/Fire/Police) all the way from Lakewood/Townsend to Green Bay. The department learned if there is an active shooter situation a lot of personnel is needed. Chief stated his team jumped right in and did a great job; he was very proud of them. The department will be hosting a similar event in Gillett coordinated with the EMS and police department to further their training in the City. Last Tuesday the department held their driver operator training and on May 24 worked with Tracy at the school for Stop the Bleed training for ninth to eleventh graders. The department has 3 new members ó Reid & Brice Winkler and Kaci Hoverson-Boehmer. The department lost 3 members ó Tod Anderson & Pat Belongia retired and Seth Rudie moved. Chief also reported that the landscaping out front of the fire house has been completed and he will be replacing the exterior building lights soon.
