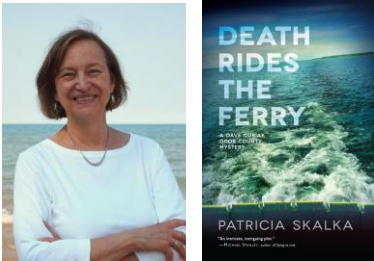


## LIBRARIAN'S REPORT – APRIL 2018

## APRIL IS FOR LIBRARIES!

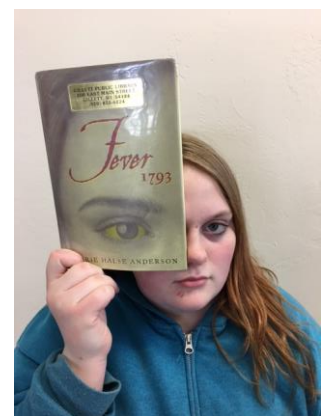
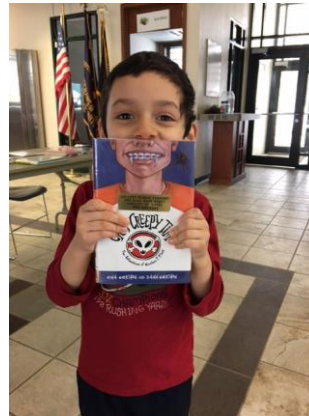
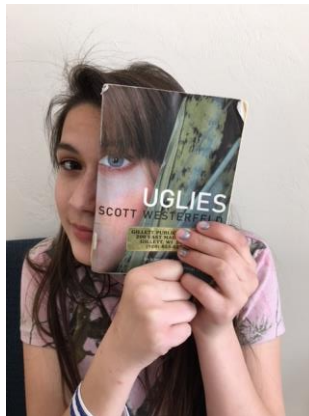

During April, the Gillett Library rewards users with chocolate every time they read a poem to the library staff. There is a **Poetry Creation Station** set up by the Circulation Desk for all who want to create their own poem. During National Library Week, our library posted online trivia questions about the library each day, and the lucky winner won the newly released cookbook by Joanna Gaines.

In celebration of **Screen-Free Week** and **Children's Book Week**, our library will be giving away an "Activity Basket" full of games, books, and fun activities to keep families off the screen during that time.
