Discussion on buying new chipper- some feel the safety features on a new model are worth the cost, some feel a piece of equipment we use 7 times year is not worth it. Miles, gas, labor, extra rents could be up to \$15,000 a year. After time from the last meeting, members feel safety is number one, and renting is not feasible, buying new is worth our schedule. Money is already borrowed at a good interest rate from leftover road project funds.

# CORONAVIRUS STATE AND LOCAL FISCAL RECOVERY FUNDS

The Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Funds provide \$350 billion to state and local governments to address the fiscal effects of the pandemic through 2024. U.S. Travel secured language in law that expressly authorizes the funds to be used to aid tourism, travel, and hospitality businesses and organizations.

NOTE: The programs have not yet become operational, with many details pending rulemaking by the Treasury Department. The following information is based on the statutory text of the American Rescue Plan Act (P.L. 117-2).

### **ALLOCATIONS**

### State Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Fund

\$220 billion provided to state, tribal, and territory governments:

- \$4.5 billion to U.S. territories
- · \$20 billion to tribal governments
- \$25.5 billion distributed to the States and the District of Columbia equally.
- \$169.8 billion distributed to the States and the District of Columbia based on unemployment rates.

### Local Coronavirus Fiscal Recovery Fund

\$130 billion provided to local governments:

- \$45.6 billion to metropolitan cities based on the formula used for the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program.<sup>1</sup>
- \$65 billion to counties based on population.
- \$19.5 billion to the States to distribute to nonmetropolitan local governments<sup>2</sup> based on population.
  - Payments are capped at 75 percent of the local government's most recent budget as of January 27, 2020.

#### Additional Information

- Payments will be split into 2 tranches, distributed at least 12 months apart.
- Before each payment, state and local governments must certify that the funds are needed to cover eligible uses.
  - Funds will be distributed no later than 60 days after such certification.
- Recipients can transfer funds to any private nonprofit organization, tribal organization transit corporation, or special-purpose unit of a state or local government.
- Local governments can also transfer funds to the State in which they are located.
