- 9. Police Department Report: Police Chief Shane Breitenbach- Written Report
 - a. Discussion on Training, Public Relations, and Incident Summary Report –215 incidents. Planning Committee asked the Police Department to make contact with the properties that need to clean up or restore the home or garage; discussed in the Planning meeting. Officers will enforce Housing Standards Ordinance. Chief stated they have a list compiled over winter.

Training:

March has been a training filled month for Chief and several of our officers. Officers Hoeft, Schultz and Chief Breitnenbach attended MCI (Major Critical Incident) training provided by Oconto County Emergency Management. This MCI training is a large scale system that incorporates all emergency responders throughout the county. EMS, Fire, and law enforcement agencies have been and continue to improve the coordinated response to these type incidents. Officer Buettner attended a federally sponsored, Crisis/Hostage Negotiator training event. These skills are critical when dealing with emotionally/ mentally disturbed individuals. With the rise of mental health issues affecting society today, Officer Buettner's new skills will be a great asset to the City when attempting to de-escalate these type incidents.

Chief is a member of the Oconto County Crisis Collaboration Team which has members from the Oconto County board, Human Services, CPS, multiple law enforcement agencies, and the medical/mental health field. The main focus of this month's meeting was on the impact that meth-amphetamine is having in our area. One of the areas being focused on is having SRO (school resource officers) in every school. Due to the rise in criminal activities in schools and thelack of mentoring presence in the schools, Chief will be reaching out to the Gillett School District for input. This is in its infancy, but we believe this could have a large impact not only on children, but the community as a whole. He welcomes any input or opinions on this matter

He has been advised that through a law enforcement support bill that was passed this month on the state level, we will be receiving \$7,000 in funds to assist with our operating costs. He would like butilize these funds for body armor and a BOLOWRAP retention system that he had mentioned to the council in his notes from last month.

The de-commissioned squad was purchased by a party in Colorado and was sold for \$7,400. He would like to have the council recognize the efforts of our police and fire departments in reference to the fatal fire which took the life of Everett Crocker. From the time of the first call until the first responders arrived on scene was minutes. Even though Mr. Crocker was not able to be saved, the responding agencies were able to contain the fire and not have it spread to other nearby homes.

One final note, Sarah Murphy has been hired to fill our full time crossing guard position. Sarah lives with her family on Orchard Circle and has been enjoying her new responsibilities. Please offer a friendly wave, a smile, and a pleasant hello when you see her!

Got some parts of the parks cleaned up from winter and plowing. working on the rest of our properties. We received a new speed limit sign which will be located by the school, need DOT approval to install. Checked storm sewers all around the city, some have been neglected for many years, they need to be redone because they are falling in. Curb install on Second Street will be done in May. Recycling grant will be submitted this month. The Industrial sign was painted by Public Works and will be reinstalled.

Running into a problem with getting parts for the project on time. Flushing Hydrants this month, there will be discoloration in the water. 133 East First Street house and garage has been razed.


Director's Corner

I just wanted to let you know that I will be traveling until early June, so I don't anticipate making any further decisions on the land until then.

FYI, Parcel 2310422353675A is also included in the sale.

As I'm sure you're aware, my land is enrolled in the Managed Forest Law (order 43-014-2007) thru 12/31/2031. When the land is sold, the new owner (potentially the City) will be subject to the terms of that contract. The purchaser will have the opportunity to withdraw the land from the MFL. A new statute was enacted on 4/8/2022 (2021 Wisconsin Act 230) which liberalizes the conditions under which the land may be withdrawn from the MFL program without having to pay a withdrawal fee or withdrawal tax. You may want to have your attorney review this so the City is fully aware of the implications.


