- 9. Police Department Report: Police Chief Breitenbach
- a. Discussion on Training, Public Relations, and Incident Summary Report -Chief Breitenbach provided the incident report: Training and Public Relations-From the Chief's Desk;

Gillett Police Department / 105 incidents / February 2024

This past month I attended the winter WI Chiefs of Police Training Conference event hosted by the WI Chiefs of Police Association. The conference assists police leaders throughout the state with educating chiefs on the ever-changing law enforcement environment. Topics discussed included major critical incident response, officer wellness and suicide prevention, police department staffing struggles, and legal updates from the WI Department of Justice, WI Attorney General's Office. This month Officer Hoeft attended the 2024 Active Threat Integrated Response Conference held in Lake Geneva. The conference covered topics such as School Safety, Violent Event Incident Management, Terrorism Trends and Tactics, Rescue Task Force, and multiple mass casualty events including Highland Park School, Decatur Township Federal Express, Tops Market Shooting, Nashville Covenant School Shooting, Manchester Arena Bombing, and the San Bernadino Terrorist attack.

Since re-posting for the open officer positions, we have received 2 additional applications for the parttime officer positions. The application process is open until the end of this month. I am hoping to start initial background processes for these candidates this coming week. I am hopefully optimistic that we will be able to move forward quickly with hiring after the April elections.

On a more positive note, I, along with help from the Gillett Public Works Department, have been working on the install of the new video surveillance system. We are approximately 50% completed with the install. This system is a major improvement from the existing system and we are looking forward to completion sometime later this month.

### 10. Fire Department Report: Fire Chief Hicks

a. Discussion on Training, Public Relations, and Incident Summary Report- One call for last month, a Lift Assist. Recruiting many firefighters that are eager to join and learn. Workers Comp Audit was completed. Toured Seneca Foods for training. Seneca implemented a new program for the fire alarms to try to fix the false alarm calls because heat sensors were triggering often in the previous system.

- 11. **Health, Protection and License Committee Report:** Alderperson VanStraten stated we have been having regular meetings. Once we get a full council and mayor, we will have a meeting to discuss the Teamsters Contract and hiring a third officer.
- 12. **Board of Public Works Committee Report: Alderperson Luther-** Alderperson Luther stated the State called him in regards to the church corner on HWY 22. They have set up vibration equipment on the corner. They are testing and making a report to know if they can correct curve of the corner. Public Works Foreman Nate Anderson stated they helped utility with new bathroom in utility garage. They have all the new logos on the trucks. They had sweeper out to clean up the debris from Aspland trimming trees for We Energies. They installed a new light on flagpole in front of City Hall, new lights for the walkway coming into City Hall, and put up the new Police Department cameras.
- 13. **Utility Committee Report:** Utility Operator Ron Anderson wrote a report:

The utility has been busy with some minor projects; the second bathroom has been completed in the utility building and is handicap accessible. The city logos are on all the utility trucks and equipment so now residents know who we are. The interim financing for the construction project will be closed this month with USDA and the grant money has been applied to the sewer portion of loan balance. We are still waiting for equipment to upgrade the SCADA system; it might be in by the time I retire. We have had some old equipment failures in a couple of pump houses, so they have been upgraded. We climbed the water tower for our annual inspection, and I couldn't get Tyler to stand on top of it with me. He said he was ok with not coming out there. We will be looking at someone to wash the tower and touch up some flaking paint. Our spring lawn maintenance is almost done, and most of our equipment is ready for the year. The roof at pump house 2 on Foelker Street will be redone as shingles were torn off from winds last year. Working on getting hydrant markers on and bad ones replaced. Other than daily things that's it, have a great evening.
